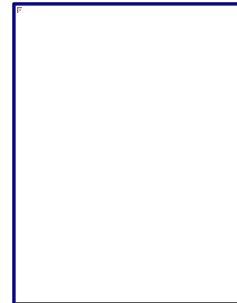

He started fairly poor in Center Line and became through hard work and brains a fairly well off person, accomplished businessman and diplomat. He served the community for many years in the service clubs he belonged to. He helped others many times. He served the community as a city councilman starting in 1981, mayor pro-tem and Mayor 2009-2015. It appears that he is well liked by all. I can say these things because I have witnessed them.

He died Saug 22, 2015 of cancer at age 72. He had saved the old Center Line Fire truck a few years earlier and it was used to carry his coffin from the Ford Funeral Home to the Center Line city Hall to the Woodside (Formerly Redeemer) Baptist Church on Hoover and North of 11 Mile. He had been Mayor for six years. At

the Ford Funeral home there were police honor guards that changed every hour. I may be an understatement to say that this man was well liked. This historian has had many contacts with him in the last nearly 70 years. We went to the same as children (Redeemer Baptist). I can report that David Hanselman treated others as he would want to be treated himself, with respect and consideration. On issues he was a real diplomat yet could be firm. He stood up against the bicycle lanes the federal government wanted put in on Van Dyke.

(then) From Feb 13, 1943 when I requested immediate induction and was sent to Fort Custer MI until I received my “ruptured duck” (a discharge emblem) at Fort Sheridan, IL with a few stops in between. I was clear headed the morning they gave us tests and did well. Many others had partied just before coming and were not. I was told I qualified for either the air force or the army engineers and I said it did not matter. The first train out took me to Fort Belvoir, VA where I had 13 weeks of combat engineer training. Upon “graduating” my whole platoon was being sent over-seas except for myself and one other. I felt bad at being left out. We were sent to HQ's and soon assigned to a new topo battalion being formed. Turned out we both had map training and experience. I had taken map courses at Wayne State and Lawrence Tech and was employed by the Army Map Service where I worked on maps of Siberia. I was immediately assigned to the editing section. I was then posted to go to the Army Specialized training program (to college). However quickly a new posting froze all personnel. We were to go overseas. We left from Hampton Roads VA on a new army transport ship, the A E Anderson. We sailed alone following a zig-zag course and landed in Casablanca. I was amazed at how modern the city was and “celebrated” my 21 birthday there. Soon we were boarding the 40 and 8's. That is a narrow track rail line with cars from WW1 and intended for 40 men or 8 horses. We traveled over the Atlas Mountains and we could have walked faster than the train getting up and over the mountains into Algeria. We set up our plant in Affreville, a rail town halfway between Oran and Algiers. We did mapping of central and northern Italy, the Dalmatian coast (then Yugoslavia) and where the British wanted to invade and Southern France where the US wanted to land and did. We worked 10 to 12 hour days but still had some time for other activities. Affreville is in a valley. To the north was Miliana, a winter resort place for wealthy Europeans prior to the war. To the south was the Sahara Desert. Both places were within walking distance. I became “adopted” by a French family of a retired railroad engineer. In spite of both American and French officers billeted in their home they always had a bedroom for me where I often stayed instead of the barracks. Through them I met many local people. One item we heard about was an error we made Italy where we showed a secondary road that turned out to be an old Roman aqueduct. Even with our latest multiplex equipment we missed on that. On the aerial photos it was man made, a hard surface and low to the ground. In November we sailed from Oran to Boston on the Santa Rosa and on arriving were given a 21 day delay in route to group again at Fort Lewis, WA. This gave all of us a chance to get home for Thanksgiving. We had done more than 500 maps while in Africa mostly for the Fifth and Seventh Armies. And now to the Pacific. We left on the Matsonia and arrived in Honolulu. We were the first entire unit to be deployed from the European Theater to the Pacific we set up shop in a very modern three story building all underground. We were

alongside the army air base, Wheeler Field. You had to take a long tunnel to access the 23 million facility and when you reached the end you were on the ground floor. I Often walked to work over the pineapple fields and then catch a ride for the tunnel. I was soon assigned with three others to an Army-Navy liaison group under navy control. There were three navy guys that were flown from Washington DC and we soon became friends. We kidded them about never being on a ship whereas we had been on three. Our job was to check aerial photos usable for mapping for mapping and show areas where we lacked for the navy to fly over and procure. We also screen intelligence information for mapping. We did maps of Japan, China, Korea, Manchuria, Okinawa and numerous of the Pacific Islands. We were working on Operations Olympic and Coronet when the atomic bomb was used. The photos we had showed the devastation that occurred but I firmly believe it saved many many lives for both the Allies and Japan. One of them could be my own as our unit was being screened for combat trained. The Japanese lost control of the seas and thus were frantically training their army for homeland defense. Our invasion of Kyushu was scheduled for the fall. We even had maps showing which military units were to land where. Over 600 hundred maps of the pacific pacific were made. during my almost three years I was in a total of thirteen camps. One more item. After getting back to the USA, I was on a troop train approaching the Moffat Tunnel in the Rockies from the west when the train jumped the tracks. Fortunately it went to the right and ground to a halt against the side of the mountain. To the left was a small shelf with a ravine and river at the bottom. We were lucky! I was discharged on Jan 22, 1946. We held annual reunions all over the country for over 50 years. We held two in Detroit. The last was Ft Lauderdale in the fall of 2002. I am still in touch with my best buddy. Of interest he and I after retirement both volunteer in pharmacy in a hospital. He in Oklahoma and me in Michigan. I had no combat but received the victory Medal, European African Middle Eastern Theater Ribbon, Asiatic Pacific Theater Ribbon and several unit commendations. In addition 4 overseas service bars and of course the Good Conduct Medal (I had them fooled on that one!) My primary unit designation was the 30th. Engineer Base Topographic Battalion. My worst memory was sleeping, or trying to, on the cold rainy wet grounds near Casablanca with no shelter or facilities. My best memory was the friendship and hospitality of both the French and Arabs in North Africa. April 21, 2009.

Harwood, Arnold was the son of Ahaz and Polly carver Harwood, born in Rutland County Vt Aug 25, 1816. His father was born in Massachusetts in 1791 and his mother in Vermont in 1800. They settled in Marshall, Calhoun Co Michigan in 1839. Arnold moved to Richmond township, Macomb County in 1843, to Mt

Clemens in 1844 where he worked until 1846. He bought a farm of forty acres in Warren Township which he partially cleared and sold, bought a farm of eighty acres, on which he cleared thirty, on which he lived for ten years. He was engaged in locating lands for a land company; located 12,000 acres for Gov. Crapo in 1852 and carried on his farm at the same time. He sold his farm in 1863 and purchased 126 acres of improved lands on section 4 where he now resides. He established and ran a lumber yard at Warren Station and in other ways has taken an active part in the development of the township. He was Justice of the Peace in 1853; appointed Notary by Gov K.S. Bingham in 1855 which office he still holds; and Highway Commissioner in 1875. He was married in 1838 to Elizabeth C daughter of Frederick and Sarah A Higgins van Fleet, to whom four children were born. His family belongs to the M E Church of which Mr Harwood was a local preacher for a quarter of a century. He was a college graduate. He created a pond on his property. (M A Leeson 1882 History of Macomb County Michigan 852-857)
